



Talk together

Ask the child to

- Point to the word Cross in the title and point to the letter pattern that makes the ss sound. Stress that these two letters make one sound.
- Point to the letters that make the beginning sounds cr. Stress that, unlike the end two consonants, ss, both letters in cr make separate sounds (c-r).
- Look out for words with two consonants at the beginning.

Read the story

Remember, children learn best when reading is relaxed and enjoyable, so give lots of praise.

- Encourage the child to try to read any words they don't recognise by saying the sounds of each letter pattern separately (e.g. G r a n), then running the sounds together quickly. If they find it difficult to say the sounds, say the sounds first and then see if they can hear the word.
- Explain that it is important when running the sounds in a word together to check it sounds like a real word as some words are less regular (e.g. her). Read these words to the child if they don't recognise them. Point out the letters that make the usual sound in each word (e.g. the h in her). This will help them to remember these words.

Flick spills her drink on the cloth. Gran is cross.



Fred drops his sandwich in the pram. Gran is cross.



But Spot the cat is glad.



The frog jumps in the jam. Fred grabs him.



Smash! Gran is cross.



The frog jumps and jumps. Spot runs and runs.



The frog jumps on the clock. Gran is cross.



At the end of the day the twins go home.



Gran is glad. The twins are glad.



But Spot is sad.



Check comprehension

Ask the child

- How are the characters feeling by the end of the story?
- Why was Gran cross? (Because the twins made a mess.)
- Why was Spot sad? (Because the twins went home.)

Check phonics (letter-pattern sounds)

Ask the child to

- Find and read some words in the book which begin with the two consonants cl (cloth, clock).
- Think of other words which begin with the sound cl (e.g. clap, club, clip).
- Find and read some words in the book which begin with the two consonants fr (Fred, frog).
- Think of other words which begin with the sound fr (from, fresh, frill).
- Try to write some words which begin with two consonants on a piece of paper (e.g. crab, crack, trick, stop, slip).
