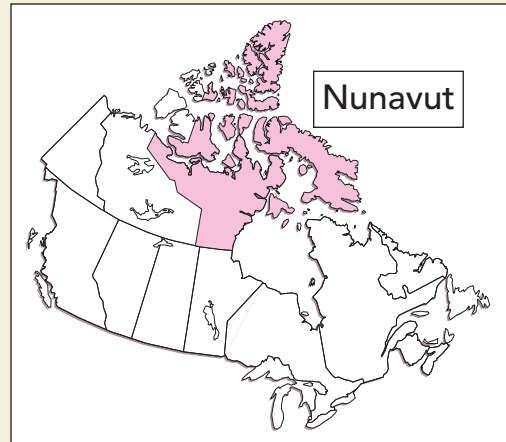

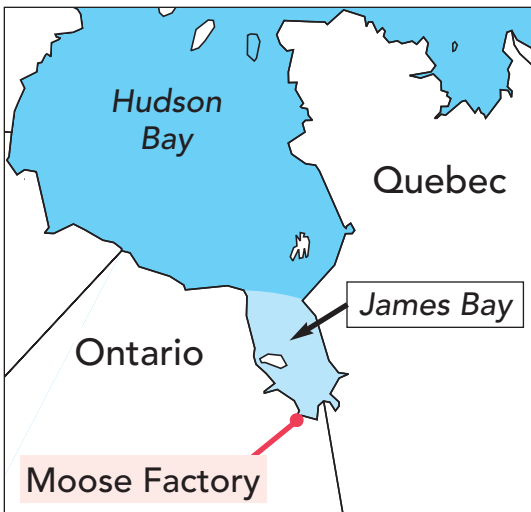
Jonathan Cheechoo

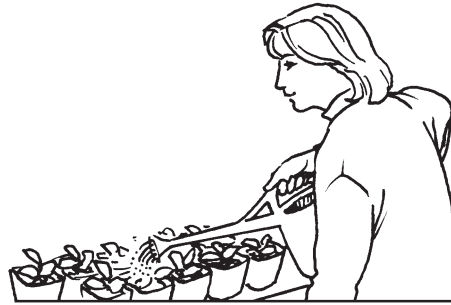

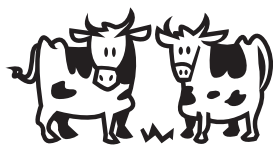
A family farm

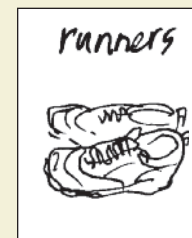

Canada's penny

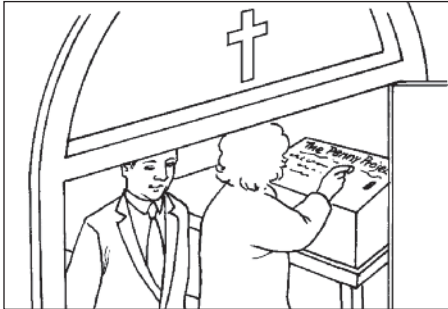
For many years, Canada had a one-cent coin called a penny. In 2012, the Canadian Mint stopped making pennies. Canada's penny had two maple leaves on it.

- She puts the coins in special paper rolls.



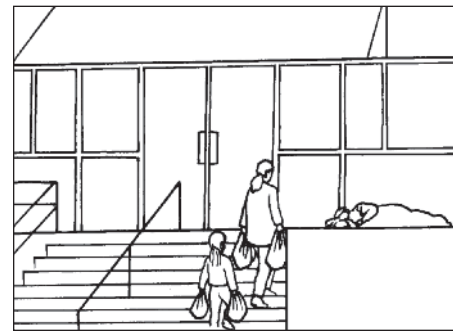
- Hannah takes the rolls of coins to the bank. She gets bills for the coins.

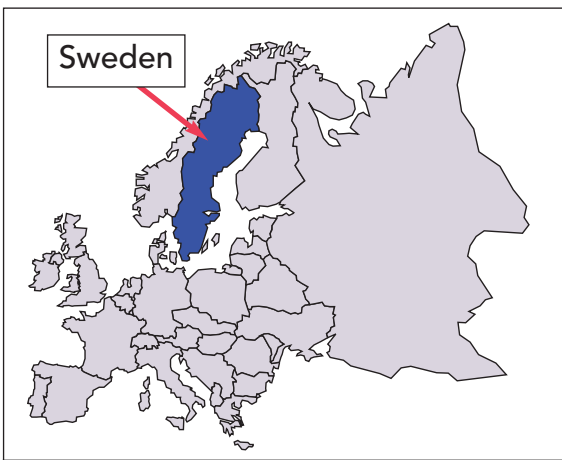
